This will be a "hands-on" workshop limited to 14 working teams. You and your dog will receive instructional guidance directly from Mitch White of Gamekeepers Retrievers.

Auditors are welcome

What to expect...

This workshop is designed for dogs and handlers that are running at an advanced Senior through a Master/Finished or QAA level. Mitch will focus on the skills needed for you and your dog to transition from Senior to Master and those skills needed to train and succeed at higher level stakes. Both land and water work will be included. Mitch will focus on advanced marking concepts, advanced blinds and advanced drills. He will include discussion on advanced training theory, pro training tips for and testing success, advanced test design and strategy for handling your dog at the higher level stakes.



The program is designed for advanced level dogs and for those dogs who are at the senior level and ready to make the jump to higher level stakes.

All dogs will be exposed to set ups which arise in advanced level tests and the drills pertinent to this level of work. Mitch will work with each team to help

them develop skills needed to succeed in Master/Finished and at Field Trials. Advanced transition dogs will be taught how to introduce advanced drills and how to break set ups down to make them approachable to a dog beginning advanced training. In addition to working dogs on marking set ups, blinds and drills, Mitch will spend time discussing topics including: training and testing strategy; mental preparation for handler and dog; and advanced test design. Individualized attention will be given to all working dog/handler teams. Auditors are encouraged to participate by asking questions during the seminar with the understanding that the answer may need to wait until the working dog has finished and Mitch can turn his attention back from the dog to the audience.

Due to the complexity of the set ups and drills only 14 WORKING TEAMS WILL BE ACCEPTED.

Each handler is allowed two dogs, but only one dog will be used on a given concept, skill or drill.

All applications will be reviewed and the most appropriate teams will be chosen for clinic.

Those teams will be notified by email and listed on the KRC web sites and FB pages.

Sunday, June 24, 2018 - 8:30 a.m. to approx. 3:00 p.m.

DAY 1: Check in will begin at 8:30 am on Friday morning.

9:00 am: Introduction. Discussion of where working teams are in training and what their goals are for the workshop. Working teams will run a set up and/or drills designed by Mitch to give him a feel for each teams abilities. Focus will be on advanced transition dogs. Intro to advanced drills, training set ups including land and water marks and blinds designed to introduce your dog to and prepare him/her for advanced work. Day will end with Q&A.

Days 2 and 3: 8:30 assemble for discussion of previous day's work and intro of advanced teams.

Focus will be on advanced dogs. Teams will run advanced drills, training set ups with advanced land and water marking concepts and advanced land and water blinds. Mitch will work with teams on advanced training theory, mental preparedness and how to dissect a test scenario to prepare a successful strategy for running and qualifying at a test.

Q&A, discussion and final address will be held at the conclusion of the workshop.

PLEASE NOTE: This is a tentative schedule.

Topics covered each day may be adjusted due to the needs of the working teams, the weather or other factors. Topics listed are representative and not meant to be all inclusive.

There will be a tremendous amount of information presented each day so breaks and lunch times will vary.
