PROGRESSING YOUR DOG is being presented to help handlers succeed in progressing their dog to the next training level. The focus of this workshop will be in analyzing each individual dog's performance, determining its weaknesses and developing a plan to move the dog forward in its training. Participants will work on problem solving skills, drills and set ups tailored to each dog's needs. Mitch will instruct each handler on how to identify their dog's areas of weakness and will coach them on developing a plan to address these areas.

Auditors will benefit greatly from this workshop as well due to the varied issues that will be discussed and the insight Mitch will provide as to each unique situation. Auditors and Handlers alike will observe and be involved in discussions as each dog presents different behaviors. This method will allow attendees to learn how to analyze in the moment and read the dog's behavior.

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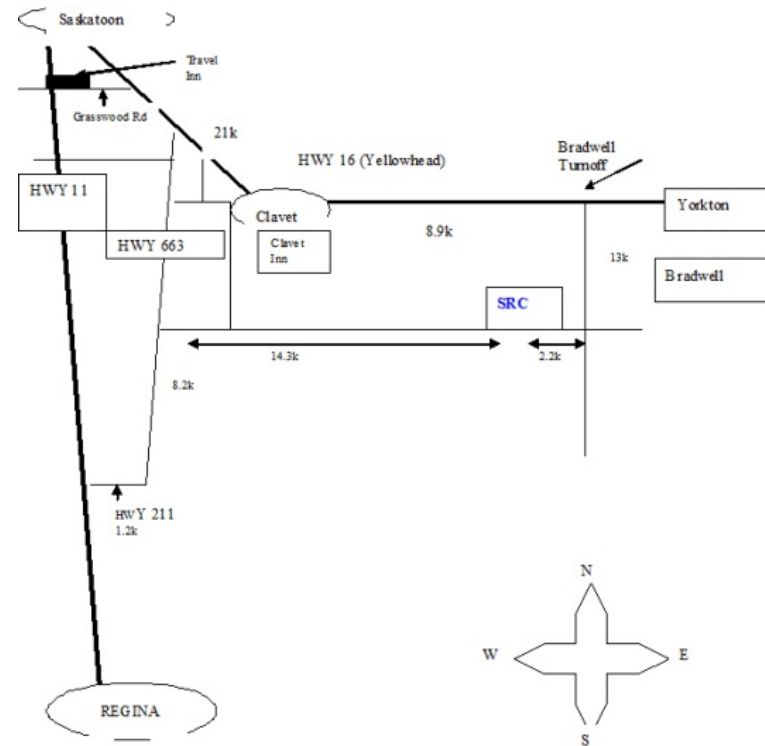

Mitch White – Head Field Trainer/Key Note Speaker:

Mitch has been training retrievers for field work since 1988 when he got his first retriever, Hershey. His program has been developed to utilize an approach that works with all breeds of retrievers. One of the main ingredients of the program is fairness to the dog. Mitch believes in putting the work into teaching the dog to create a skill set to aid the dog in making decisions. Poor decisions are corrected and good decisions are praised. Since Mitch trains many different breeds, he often has to get “outside of the box” from popular retriever training methods. Mitch also gets a lot of dogs in for “rehab” work. These are dogs that have been in other programs and have developed issues that have prevented them from going further in training. Mitch has had tremendous success turning these dogs around so they become confident workers again.

Since 2004, Mitch’s clients and students have earned countless field titles and placements, at all levels, including several Master National Qualifiers and Finalists and dogs with Field Trial placements.

Mitch’s training manuals will be available for purchase at the workshop for \$45 each. These texts contain extensive material about the Gamekeepers Retrievers training program over and above that material that will be supplied in your workshop booklet.

Topics of training will include but not be limited to...

Identifying weaknesses and prescribing exercises for them
Learn to pinpoint issues on the fly and adjust your approach to an exercise to help the dog progress
Reading a scenario to analyze how your individual dog is likely to react
Build a training plan for progress



- Schedule -

Saturday and Sunday, May 19 - 20 - 8:30 am to approx. 5:00 pm

Monday, May 21 - 8:30 am to approximately 3:00 pm

- Format -

(subject to change as necessary during the workshop)

DAY 1: Check in will begin at 8:00 am on Saturday morning.

8:30 am: Introduction. Discussion of where Working Teams are in training and of their goals for the workshop. Working Teams will run a set up and/or drills designed by Mitch to give him a feel for each Working Teams’ abilities.

Day 1 will continue with working one on one with each team. Focus will be in determining weaknesses and designing training scenarios and/or drills that will help each team turn that weakness into a strength. Day will end with Q&A.

Day 2: Meet at 8:30 am for a discussion of previous day’s work. Each team will continue working with Mitch on targeted exercises designed pinpoint weaknesses and progress the dog in training. Extensive land and water work will be featured in the form of yardwork, drills, marks, blinds, test like scenarios, etc. Analysis of each dogs performance and how to troubleshoot the problems will be discussed as well as discussion on why a particular drill or set up is the prescribed solution. Day will end with Q&A.

Day 3: Meet at 8:30 for a discussion of previous day’s work, then out to the field for a continuation training. Q&A, discussion and final address will be held at the conclusion of the workshop.

PLEASE NOTE: This workshop is fluid and topics covered will be based on the needs of the dogs as they present training weaknesses. Topics covered each day may be adjusted due to the needs of the working teams, the weather or other factors.

There will be a tremendous amount of information presented each day so breaks and lunch times will vary.
