THE BLIND WORKSHOP IS COMING TO THE **MILE HI GOLDEN RETRIEVER CLUB!**

This workshop will help handlers succeed in the training and running of better land and water blinds. The focus of this workshop is solely on blinds and will only utilize marks as they influence blinds. Throughout each day, working teams will perform various drills to improve lining, casting and handling on blinds. In addition, multiple types of blinds will be run each day. Blinds will be run that represent different levels of difficulty and each blind will be rated so that handlers may chart their progress during the seminar.

In addition to yard and field work, discussions will be held on topics such as; how elements will affect blinds, understanding the mechanics involved in setting up a good blind and learning how to design good training blinds. Evaluating blinds at tests and developing a strategy for success will also be discussed.



Working Dog and Handler teams will be limited to running TWO (2) dogs throughout the seminar. Please note that only ONE (1) dog may be run per training segment.

Auditors are strongly encouraged and Mitch welcomes questions from the audience. If you and your dog have not advanced to the point of beginning blinds. watching Mitch quide each working team through various drills and blind work will help give you a greater understanding of why your foundation work is so important and will help you establish your goals for advancement.

Everyone attending the seminar will be presented

with a workbook of the material Mitch will be covering over the weekend.

From I-25 exit 250 onto Hwy 56. West on Hwy 56 (9 miles) continuing through Berthoud and across Hwy 287 until the Hwy turns north on N CoRd 23. North on N CoRd 23 1/2 mile then west on CoRd 8e toward Carter Lake. Continue on CoRd 8e approximately 4 miles, after you pass the Carter Lake pay station, the road will switchback up the ridge, at the first intersection, stay to the left and continue around the south side of Carter Lake on S CoRd 31. You will see the campgrounds and south side boat ramp on the west side of the road. Follow the road south from the lake staying to the right when there is a parallel split. CoRd 31 S ends at Dorband's property and we will have signs out about where to park...

Mitch White – Head Field Trainer/Key Note Speaker:

Mitch has been training retrievers for field work since 1988 when he got his first retriever, Hershey. His program has been developed to utilize an approach that works with all breeds of retrievers. One of the main ingredients of the program is fairness to the dog. Mitch believes in putting the work into teaching the dog to create a skill set to aid the dog in making decisions. Poor decisions are corrected and good decisions are praised. Since Mitch trains many different breeds, he often has to get "outside of the box" from popular retriever training methods. Mitch also gets a lot of dogs in for "rehab" work. These are dogs that have been in other programs and have developed issues that have prevented them from going further in training. Mitch has had tremendous success turning these dogs around so they become confident workers again.

Since 2004, Mitch's clients and students have earned countless field titles <u>per year</u>, at all levels, including several Master National Qualifiers and Finalists and dogs with Field Trial placements.

Seminar Requirements:

Working teams should meet the following requirements to participate:

- 1. Handlers must have a basic understanding of a blind retrieve.
- 2. Working dogs must have a solid Basics foundation.
- 3. Working dogs must have a remote sit and solid obedience.
- 4. Working dogs must have an understanding of handling, they should be working on the Double T and have run basic sight blinds.
- Working dogs that are through transition drills well enough to run a basic cold blind will get the most out of this seminar.

DAY 1: Check in will begin at 8:30 am on Saturday morning.

The morning will begin with an introductory lecture on blinds, blind concepts and the theories on training for blinds on both land and water will be presented during the workshop. Then the working teams will start running various drills and types of blinds under Mitch's direct guidance. During these training segments, Mitch will answer questions from all participants and auditors that arise about the training techniques that are being taught. The day will end with a Q & A session and short lecture summarizing the days events.

DAY 2: The morning will begin with brief follow up discussions about the previous days training and a brief Q & A session to cover any new questions that have come up about the previous days work. New drills and blinds will be introduced and training will follow the same format as Friday.

PLEASE NOTE: This is a tentative schedule.

Topics covered each day may be adjusted due to the needs of the working teams, the weather or other factors. Topics listed are representative and not meant to be all inclusive.

ALL BLIND LEVELS WILL BE WORKED EACH DAY.
